The 23-year-old Oxfordshire man was ambushed by Lenshinas in the wild Chinsali bush. In the same attack, Inspector Peter Jordan of Lusaka was mortally wounded.

But burly Pat Hopwood can remember very little about the attack.

"All I can remember is seeing them coming at us firing their muzzle-loaders. I can recall firing a few shots from my .303 and then nothing," he told The Northern News.

An old friend and former senior police officer, Mr. Trevor Wright, invited Pat to stay on his Choma farm while he was convalescing.

"I still receive medical treatment every day and I don't know when I'll be back on active duty. In the meantime, I just sit around, admire the scenery and play a few games of golf, said the inspector.
